Renmark Christmas

THE Christmas spirit has returned to Renmark for 2022 in a modified way, as the local council celebrates the holiday season while also protecting the town from flood risks.

Renmark Paringa Council's scaled-back Renmark's Christmas On the Murray Festival 2022 began Sunday, December 2, with the Carols in the Garden event at the Jarrett Memorial Gardens.

A Renmark Paringa Council spokesperson said the minimised program aimed to create a "festive feel in the town", while also ensuring the community was protected. "The timing of the

council-facilitated festive events, together with the unprecedented demands placed on council's resources with the ongoing rising river levels and forecasted River Murray flood peak means that we are unable to commit to delivering the whole program of planned events for 2022," the spokesperson said.

"Although the Festival program will not run as originally planned, we are pleased that some events will continue and that Christmas will still shine bright throughout the town.

The Adelaide Big Band Christmas Bash, to be performed at the Chaffey

Theatre on Saturday, December 10 highlights the remainder of council's scaledback festival program.

A pancake breakfast raising funds for the planned Royal Flying Doctor Service patient transfer facility will be held Saturday, December 17 in the Jarrett Memorial Gardens, with Christmas Fun at the Library also taking place on the same day, involving an interactive show by Cool 4 Kids, Santa's Cave, and face painting.

The Belgravia Family Fun Day at the pool will be held at the Renmark Swimming Centre on Sunday, December 18, before council's school holiday

program begins on Monday, December 19 and runs to Friday, December 23.

The town's large Christmas tree, and giant festive star decoration, will also be lit up for the festival.

"While it is unfortunate that these changes are necessary, council's highest priority is and must be the protection of our community," the spokesperson said.



Lamington **Strawberry Wreath**

Ingredients

500g strawberries (frozen or fresh)

150g caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla bean paste

500ml thickened cream

26 lamington fingers Extra 500g fresh strawberries

(for decoration)



- 1. Place 500g strawberries and 115g caster sugar in a large saucepan over medium heat. Cook, crushing strawberries with a wooden spoon for 10 minutes or until sugar has dissolved. Bring to the boil Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer for 10 minutes or until mixture is syrupy
- Remove mixture from heat and strain through a fine sieve into a jug. Discard solids. Wash, dry and return syrup to the saucepan. Stir in vanilla bean paste. Bring to a simmer over medium heat and simmer for 12 minutes or until slightly thickened. Remove from heat and set aside to cool completely.
- Using an electric mixer, beat cream and remaining sugar until justfirm peaks form. Add 1/3 cup of strawberry syrup to cream. Fold through gently to create a rippled effect.
- Carefully spoon cream mixture into a large snap-lock bag (or piping bag) and snip 2cm off one corner. Pipe a 23cm ring of cream on a flat serving plate to form the base. This ring will secure the lamingtons to the plate.
- Pipe cream mixture onto one face of a lamington. Place lamington on its side on cream ring to start assembling the wreath. Pipe cream onto another lamington and sandwich together with first lamington. Repeat process to form the wreath.
- Reserve 12 fresh strawberries. Hull and finely dice remaining strawberries. Cut three of the reserved strawberries in half. Top wreath with strawberry decorations and spoon over remaining syrup mixture. Serve immediately

Watermelon **Nojitos**



Recipe

115g caster sugar 1.5kg watermelon, peeled and chopped

2 limes, sliced

2 tsp finely grated lime rind 500ml chilled soda water

90ml lime juice

1 small bunch fresh mint, sprigs picked

1 tbsp caster sugar, plus extra

Ice cubes, to serve



Method

- 1. Place sugar and 1 cup water in a small saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until sugar dissolves. Increase heat to high. Bring to the boil. Boil, without stirring, for 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Set aside to cool completely.
- Place watermelon in a blender and blend until smooth.
- Grate lime rind before slicing. Place lime slices in a large jug. Using the end of a rolling pin, slightly crush lime to release juice. Add watermelon, soda water, lime juice and cooled sugar syrup. Stir to combine. Add
- Combine extra sugar and lime rind on a small plate. Place 1/4 cup water in a separate bowl. Dip the rim of serving glasses into water, then in sugar mixture. Divide ice among glasses. Add watermelon mixture. Serve immediately.
