

# Ticketing options for the 2025 Field Days

SEVERAL options are available to purchase tickets to the 2025 Riverland Field Days.

Tickets are \$20 online and at the gate, or \$18 for early birds at selected venues, while students and children under 18 are free to enter.

"You can purchase tickets online, even on the days of the Field Days event, and the price won't change regardless of when they are purchased," said Emma Gwiazda, Field Days manager.

Limited cash will be on hand at gates, and Eftpos machines will be operating.

"We are accepting cash at the gates, but there won't be much change available," Mrs Gwiazda said.

"We're encouraging people to bring either the right amount of money for the amount of people in the group and just be aware that we might not have change for bigger notes."

Organisers say having online bookings helps to reduce the workload on the Field Days volunteers, and is a convenient way for patrons to get their tickets.



# Field Days Safari keeps getting better

THE children's Safari is back and bigger than ever at this year's Riverland Field Days.

The time-honoured tradition will feature nearly 50 exhibitors on the trail map and have plenty of children joining the fun across the two days.

The ever-popular trail encourages children to visit exhibitors and collect their promotional materials throughout the site,

from outdoors in the main rows to the pavilion and marquee pavilion, similar in concept to the Yellow Brick Road at the Adelaide Show.

Interim Safari co-ordinator Samantha Prider, from Rivergum Christian College, is optimistic about participation this year, despite the clash with other local sporting events.

"You could plan to visit on

both days and start to cross off your exhibitor map on Friday, and continue on Saturday," Mrs Prider said.

"Our exhibitors are spread everywhere so it can be quite tiring for little legs to tackle the trail in one go. Nobody wants to miss out on any goodies."

In fact, Mrs Prider recommends families prepare well for their Safari adventure.

"Make sure you bring a water bottle and wear sunscreen and a hat," she said.

"Some families bring a garden cart with them, or make the kids walk and put the freebies in their pushers. We find that the starter bags are large, but it doesn't take many site visits for them to overflow."

To help lighten the load, Rivergum has made a tent adjacent to the Safari site available for families to stop and rest on their journey.

"We've called it 'Safari Ranger's Rest' and it's a place for families to just stop for a minute in the shade, refill their drink bottles, refresh the sunscreen, sit down and let the kids play quietly," Mrs Prider said.

"We'll have a reading corner, some colouring, activities and toys so that anyone who needs a 66

minute away from the crowd can recharge in relative peace. It's free and available to all."

Rivergum Christian College principal Jessica Clark is excited for the school to be hosting the Safari again this year, and looks forward to meeting the children as they visit the Rivergum tent next door.

"I love seeing what the children have already collected as they add our giveaway to their stash," Mrs Clark said.

"It's great to hear about all the things they can see and do at the Field Days."

Mrs Clark is particularly thankful for the exhibitors who sign up to spread some joy on the trail each year.

"We couldn't do this without the amazing support of the local businesses and organisations who give up their time, money and energy to make it so great," she said.

"People are staying up late baking biscuits, or packing things in bags, adding stickers and hauling boxes of merchandise to their sites just to put a smile on kid's faces. With the negative outlook for our economy right now it's important to do something positive where we can."

Mrs Prider also warned families that if they attend later on Saturday they may be disappointed.

"There are only 350 bags available, and we usually sell out before Saturday lunchtime, so don't leave your Field Days trip until the last minute or you might miss out," she said.






