

### All about family and farming

THE Riverland Field Days, in its 64th year, has long had a strong focus on being a family-orientated event.

It is the Riverland's premier agricultural and horticultural showcase event, and has grown to cater to a broad range of interests, from cooking and gardening to recreational vehicles, fashion and music.

"Yes, it's an agricultural show and it has mostly been about the agricultural side of things throughout the event's history to provide great opportunities for our local farmers and businesses," said Emma Gwiazda, Field Days manager.

"But at the same time, our farmers are not going to want to come out just by themselves, they want their families to come out as well.

"We try and include as much for the families as we can.

"We have a large amount of apparel coming this year, and some new distilleries bringing some of their goods for us to try. We also have our local and statewide services that will have sites at the event to talk about things like succession planning, financial planning, and accounting.

"We will have home builders on site, for families who are looking at potentially purchasing land, or rebuilding a house. There will be non-local builders available for some new or different options."

Schooling and higher-education exhibitors will also be on site throughout the two days in September.

'Quite a few schools from Adelaide will be popping up to have a chat with Riverlanders, in case they're looking at sending their children to a school in Adelaide for their final years, and some universities too, to have a look at and get information on future options," Mrs Gwiazda said.

"We will also have TAFE SA set up with information on the Murray River Study Hub - a local tertiary study option for the region if your kids don't want to travel, or if you want them to stay close by."



# Let's talk about safety on your farm

MORE than 190,000 stobie poles and 35,000km of power-line are present across South Australia's cropping regions.

Both are an essential part of supplying electricity to communities across the state, but they can also pose a safety hazard needing management on farms.

On average, 20 South Australians are involved in accidents each year from farm equipment – such as trucks, tractors or harvesters – coming into contact with stobie poles or powerlines.

"A tip truck makes contact with powerlines while making a delivery, a tractor runs straight over the top of a stobie pole, a boom sprayer contacts a powerline while being raised – these are just some of the incidents that regularly occur on South Australian broadacre farms," said Paul Roberts, SA Power Networks head of corporate affairs.

"We have seen a surge in on-farm incidents with about 30 reported in (both) 2021 and 2022 and a similar number likely in 2023.

"Whether it is a farmer harvesting the crop, a contractor building a new shed, or people working in the grain-handling area of the farm, overhead powerlines are a clear hazard and a

potentially fatal risk to be aware of."

Mr Roberts said the reality was on-farm incidents could be avoided through ensuring farmers and farm employees have an appropriate work site away from powerlines, and undertaking thorough planning before completing any tasks.

#### Extra care is suggested when on-farm work involves:

- Using high vehicles or tall machinery, such as cranes or augers
- Relying on GPS to steer your vehicle

- Raising the tipper tray of trucks
- Raising farm equipment such as irrigation pipes overhead
- Climbing on top of machinery or storage silos
- Farm workers and contractors who are not familiar with your property and the location of powerlines.

#### What to do if contact with powerlines is made

When contact is made with powerlines, there is a high chance of electric shock. SA Power Networks should be contacted immediately by calling 13 13 66, and you should not move – preferably and if safe to stay – until the power is switched off.

If it is necessary to leave the vehicle or machinery, several steps must be followed to maximise safety:

#### STEP 1

Jump out and clear of the vehicle with your feet together, and do not touch the vehicle and ground at the same time.

#### STEP 2

Using shuffling steps with your feet close together, move calmly

to at least 10 metres away.

#### STEP 3

Call SA Power Networks immediately on 13 13 66.

#### STEP 4

Stay clear of the vehicle until help arrives.

#### STEP 5

Wait for SA Power Networks staff to confirm that the powerline is now safe.

The Look Up and Live app is a free and simple tool to help safely plan and/or perform work. The use of the app can help minimise contact and reduce risk of injury or death from electrocution, plus damage to equipment and the electricity network.

The app is available to download via the App Store and Google Play, or visit the website (www.lookupandlive.com.au) for more information.

SA Power Networks will be on site at Riverland Field Days this month in the Exhibition Pavilion to talk about on-farm safety.

"Our people on site will be able to handle a range of enquiries about energy matters," Mr Roberts said.

"If there is something else you would like to chat about other than safety, just ask. We'll be more than happy to help."
