



Rose and Garden Festival throughout the years

Below are extracts from the Riverland Rose and Garden Festival's history. A sincere thanks to Shann Hausler for her research. The full version will be published in parts in The Murray Pioneer leading into this year's festival...



1994

THE MURRAY PIONEER TUESDAY 22 AUGUST 1994

Former ABC rural officer
Jon Lamb will open the 1995
Rose Festival and rose expert,
Eric Trimper, will be a guest
lecturer. The Rose Festival will
be opened on the Saturday
night, at a Sherry party at the
Renmark Hotel Entertainment
Room.

Festival organisers for the 1995 Rose Festival said forms for the Best Renmark Gardens would be available at the Renmark Garden Centre, or Lynny's Card Shop in Clark's Arcade (owned by Eithne Sidhu).

There will be a Rose Ball on Saturday 21 October at the Renmark Hotel. Walking and bus tours will also be available.

The Riverland Rose and Garden Festival was the brainchild of Eithne Sidhu who collaborated with David Ruston to run the very first festival in 1994, then known as 'Rose Week'. She saw it as an event to bring people into the town and to promote Renmark as the Rose Capital

of Australia, and her vision has certainly been realised.

THE MURRAY PIONEER TUESDAY 11 OCTOBER 1994 'ROSE FESTIVAL PLANNED'

A festival to honour Renmark as the rose capital of Australia will be organised in October next year (1995), from 21 to 29 October, and it will be highlighted by David Ruston's Open Garden Day on 22 October, Mrs Quigley's Garden Day, on 24 October, and the Renmark Show, on 28 October 1995.

The Renmark Chamber of Commerce hopes to plant more roses in Renmark and it will encourage local organisations to hold an event in 1995 and to decorate shops with roses during the Rose Festival.

THE MURRAY PIONEER FRIDAY 28 OCTOBER 1994

The newspaper featured a photograph of visitors to David Ruston's Open Garden Day at Woodbridge, his 1.6-hectare property featuring 50,000 roses, comprising 4,000

different varieties. The garden also featured iris, daylilies, exotic trees, shrubs, and perennials.

THE MURRAY PIONEER FRIDAY 11 NOVEMBER 1994

"a \$1,000 cash prize is being offered by Riverland Security (Mr Ted Wescombe) for a Garden Competition for the 1995 Renmark Rose Festival".

Mr Chris Brooke (Chamber of Commerce president) said the Rose Festival was to promote Renmark as a tourist destination.

Mr Brooke said the Festival would coincide with both the Renmark Show and Open Garden Day at David Ruston's Rose Garden, Woodbridge.

1995

FIRST ROSE FESTIVAL 21 OCTOBER TO 29 OCTOBER

Opened by: Jon Lamb Guest Speaker: Eric Trimper Theme: Display of Specimen Roses (Institute Floral Display)

Twenty gardens were open, with bus tours, floral carpets, guided walking tours and Devonshire teas on houseboats moored at Renmark wharf. There was a school poster competition, colourful window displays in shops and cellar door sales at Renmano and Angove Wines. Eithne Sidhu, the first Rose Festival president, mentioned seven busloads had been booked. Eithne said as it was Renmark's first Rose Festival, so it was hard to know what to expect. She said the two major highlights were the Rose Ball (hosted by Renmark Mayor Rod Thomas and Cynthia Thomas) and the Open Day at David Ruston's rose garden, the largest rose garden in the southern hemisphere.

2000

SIXTH ROSE FESTIVAL 15 OCTOBER TO 22 OCTOBER

Opened by: Anne Ruston (CEO of the National Wine Centre)
Theme: One Thousand Years of Roses (Institute Floral Display)

Over 600 people attended the official opening. At least 24 buses had booked in, with over 5000 visitors. Eric and Myrtle Trimper judged the rose gardens. There was a Bridal Show at Olivewood, a Greek Taverna and a fishing competition, and 'Tea, Wine and Roses' at the council chambers. Save the Children Fund Renmark group held a luncheon. Angove's Wines staged an opera 'On Broadway with Pot Pourri'. David Ruston and 40 volunteers picked thousands of roses to feature in the Institute Display.

2004

TENTH ROSE FESTIVAL 16 OCTOBER TO 24 OCTOBER

Official opening of the Australian National Rose Arrangement Championship and the Inland Iris Championship at Renmark Institute.

Official Opening of a Rose Arbour in the garden adjacent to the bus bay on Renmark Avenue, to commemorate 10 years of the Rose Festival.

The Open Garden Scheme has increased in popularity.

Cooltong couple, Deidre and Frank Albanese won the Grand Champion Award.

2010

SIXTEENTH ROSE FESTIVAL 15 OCTOBER TO 24 OCTOBER

Opened by: David Ruston OAM **Theme:** Australian Icons (Institute Floral Display)

100th Renmark and District Show (the last one).

Unveiling of David Ruston OAM sculpture by Sheenagh Harris, president of the World Federation of Rose Societies. David's sculpture: 'A Life in Flowers' by Janette Moore and John Draper. Money raised by public worldwide donations.

First year of the Renmark Rose Festival Fair (Jarrett Memorial Gardens)

Interstate and overseas visitors attending the unveiling of the David Ruston Sculpture swelled the numbers attending the Rose Festival. Due to the cold winter, arrangers were forced to buy roses for the Institute display.

The Floral Display in the Institute was very popular with arrangements featuring the Sydney Opera House, Port Arthur and the Great Barrier Reef and other icons.

Fourteen Riverland gardens were open and 31 attractions catered to a multitude of interests. The inaugural Rose Fair (initiated and organised by Shann Hausler with advice

from Tim Grieger and support from secretary Miriam McLean) was held in the Jarrett Gardens. Many of the stalls featured local produce. Jill Eckermann was the guest artist at Angove Wines.

2014

TWENTIETH ROSE FESTIVAL 17 OCTOBER TO 26 OCTOBER

Opened by:

Andrew 'Cosi' Costello Theme: Let's Celebrate (Institute Floral Display)

Inaugural Black and White Ball

The newly planted rose bed of 'Renmark's Rose', in front of the fountain, is beginning to flourish. Forty-four activities this year included the Festival Fair, a Mystery Bus Tour and M.V. Barrungul cruises. There was an increase in all areas of entertainment, with 25 Open Gardens and 15 Art Trail options. Angove Wines sponsored Julie Wallis, a fused glass artist.

2019

TWENTY-FIFTH ROSE FESTIVAL 18 OCTOBER TO 27 OCTOBER

Theme: 'The Rose' (Institute Rose Display)

May: David Ruston OAM passed away.

Ruston Roses re-opened by new owners.

Chef in the Garden: 'Fine Dining by the Murray River' in Jarrett Memorial Gardens. Catered by Peter Kent, of Salt and Pepper Catering.

There was a Gala Dinner at Ruston's Rose Centre with five ambassadors. The Art Trail Functions have increased to 21. There were 32 Open Gardens and 64 activities across the Riverland. The floral display at the Institute was very popular, with Danny Hoffman's stage display drawing many viewers.

Community mourns rosarian

WELL-KNOWN FORMER RENMARK RESIDENT AND INTERNATIONAL ROSE EXPERT KELVIN TRIMPER AM, PASSED AWAY AT HIS ADELAIDE HOME EARLIER THIS YEAR, AGED 69.

Born and raised in Renmark, Mr Trimper was just 11 years old when he helped bud the first 6,000 roses in the garden of Renmark legend David Ruston OAM.

Mr Trimper went on to become president of the World Federation of Rose Societies and in 2018 was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia for his leadership qualities and extraordinary contribution to horticulture and property development.

His passion for roses saw him develop, along with this wife Melanie, a prize-winning garden of approximately 2,000 roses at Greenwith.

Mr Trimper was active at state, national and international level as a judge, consultant and rose garden advisor, and was widely recognised for his expertise and community work.

In addition to his AM, he was the recipient of the Gold Medal of the World Federation of Rose Societies, the Australian Rose Award (ARA) and the T.A. Stewart Memorial Award



(SMA), and was a Fellow of the Urban Development Institute of Australia (SA division), and of the University of South Australia.

Mr Trimper was an important member of previous Riverland Rose and Garden Festival committees, and attended in 2016 to officially open the event.

In addition to his love of roses, Mr Trimper was also a prominent businessman, urban development manager, and garden and horticulture writer, making regular media appearances.

He is survived by his wife,

Melanie, daughter Kirsty, son Adam and daughter-in-law Ruby. Kelvin Trimper and David Ruston with Chaffey MP Tim Whetstone, at the Renmark Rose Festival, in 2016.



Tribute to David Ruston

DAVID RUSTON WAS BORN AND RAISED IN RENMARK, AND WOULD BECOME ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST RESPECTED ROSARIANS, WHOSE PROFICIENCY WITH FLOWERS IS LEGENDARY.

David's father first planted 500 roses, which extended to eventually 50,000 bushes covering over 11 hectares. This was the largest private collection of roses in the southern hemisphere and was recognised as "the national collection of roses'. Today it is now a privately-owned garden.

David held many positions over the years, including president of the National Rose Society of Australia (1986), president of the World Federation of Rose Societies (WFRS), (1991 to 1994), foundation president of Heritage Rose in Australia (1986 to 1993), president of the Renmark Garden Club (for an incredible total of 32 years), foundation president



of the Chaffey branch of the Rose Society of South Australia (1996), and chairman of the WFRS Heritage Rose Committee. He was elected president Emeritus of the WFRS in 2009, a particularly big honour, and one which

recognised his status in the world of roses.

He would receive the World Federation of Rose Societies' rose pin in 1988, and gold medal in 2004, the Deane Ross Memorial Award in 1997, and the prestigious Dean Hole Medal, in 2003, from the Royal Horticultural Society. This international medal paid tribute to the effect David had not just on our local communities, but also internationally.

David had an accepting nature and a welcoming personality that set him apart, He had a way of making everyone feel special and it wasn't hard to warm to him.

David will be remembered in his hometown through the Riverland Rose and Garden festival, plantings of his Renmark rose in the town centre of Renmark, and his contribution to the community. A memorial statue of David can be seen in the Jarrett Memorial gardens in Renmark.

David passed away on Sunday 19 May 2019, aged 89 years.
